Bob died peacefully, surrounded by family on January 21, 2017. Survived by his wife Alwynn, daughters Reisa and Riva, brother Ray, son-in-law Ian and grandson London. Born in Vancouver on April 19, 1937 Bob grew up in East Vancouver and attended John Oliver High School. After graduating, Bob enjoyed the thrill of flying Harvard airplanes as a naval officer in training (flying division). Upon graduation from UBC (B.Com) Bob worked in business before returning to UBC for teacher training. It was at UBC that he met and married Alwynn. The intrepid couple honeymooned for a year, travelling all over Europe. Bob was an avid skier (Grouse Mountain Ski Patrol) and photographer. After receiving his M.Ed. Bob taught at McGill University for several years. In 1976 he returned to Vancouver and served as the Director of AV Services and Production at BCIT until he retired in 1997. Bob loved to travel and spent much of his retirement years visiting countries around the world. A celebration for Bob will be held on Saturday, February 18.
