Lew Fick had at least 1 UNTD summer and probably 2 or 3. He was a Modern History Major and in his 1947 graduation blurb, referred to himself as ex-Navy and that his intention was to become a teacher. As his brief obit indicates, he did just that, becoming the Principal of Danforth Technical Institute in the east end of Toronto; That school is now known as Danforth Collegiate and Technical Institute, an imposing building that has been around since the 1920s.

It is known for having sent more of its students and staff to the Second World War than any other school in Canada, and has a large stained-glass window in the library to act as its war memorial. During World War II, its facilities were used for Combined Operations training.
