Burleigh was born on March 6, 1925 in Bracebridge, Ontario to David and Alice (nee Cowan) and raised

in Toronto, where he attended Riverdale Collegiate. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy during World War II and served in the Indian Ocean. After graduating from the University of Toronto, Burleigh taught history in Chapleau, Palmerston and Brantford, where he became vice-principal of North Park Collegiate. Burleigh was always an active member of the community and after his retirement became a member of the Grand River Kiwanis Club and the Canadian Diabetes Association. He joined the UNT D in October, 1943 and as the obit indicates, went into the RCNVR on active service for at least 1 year. I have no record of that service, but if it was in the Indian Ocean, and in a Canadian ship, it would have been in UGANDA. Returning to U of T post-war, there is no indication that he rejoined the UNT D.

UNT Ds did not start to appear in the Canadian Navy Lists until 1949. Prior to that time they were taken in as, dressed as and treated as, Ordinary Seamen "Officer Candidates". In the Fall of 1948 they were elevated in appearance and status to "Officer Cadet" and their White Twist first appeared.
