JAMES ROBERT DE JAGER JACKSON F.R.S.C.

University Professor Emeritus, University of Toronto. Born St. Andrews, Scotland, 14 July 1935, died 29 April 2011 in Toronto after a long illness borne without bitterness. Robin taught English at Victoria College from 1964 until his retirement in 2001, and worked on research projects at the British Library in London every summer for even longer. Starting as a specialist on S. T. Coleridge but steadily broadening his range, he was the author of many books on the literature of the Romantic Period, from theory and criticism to editions and bibliographies, including a study of poetry by women that was dedicated to his two daughters. His last work, recently completed, was a comprehensive database of Romantic Poetry in English. An expert introduced him to an audience once as 'a scholar's scholar and a human being's human being'; he was learned, funny, gentle, and stubborn as a mule. He will be very fondly remembered by friends, colleagues, and former students, as well as by the immediate family - his wife Heather, daughters Katherine and Elizabeth, and sister Jennifer Jackson of North Yorkshire. He had 3 UNTD summers; 1954, 1955, 1956 and was promoted to SLT RCN(R), sen. 1 Jul '56, O-36024, attached to CATARAQUI. He was promoted to A/LT RCN(R) sen. 1 Jul '58 and was on the Ret'd List by 1960.
